Critics largely ignored his work until after his presumed suicide in 1890.
W	It is a type of distilled alcoholic beverage made from fermented grain mash. Various grains (which may be malted) are used for different varieties, including barley, corn (maize), rye, and wheat. It is typically aged in wooden casks, generally made of charred white oak.
X	They are a form of electromagnetic radiation, as are radio waves, infrared radiation, visible light, ultraviolet radiation and microwaves. They are used in treating cancer and in exploring the cosmos.
Y	It is a global video-sharing website headquartered in San Bruno, California, United States. The service was created by three former PayPal employees in February 2005. In November 2006, it was bought by Google for US\$1.65 billion.
