C	Any of various large aquatic reptiles that are native to tropical and subtropical regions and have thick, armorlike skin and long tapering jaws.
D	It is an inherited defect in perception of red and green; red-green colorblindness.
E	It is a severe and often fatal disease in humans and nonhuman primates (monkeys and chimpanzees) caused by a virus; characterized by high fever and severe internal bleeding; can be spread from person to person; is largely limited to Africa.
F	It is a powder which is made by grinding cereal grains, or other seeds or roots (like Cassava). It is the main ingredient of bread
G	It is a style of architecture developed in northern France that spread throughout Europe between the 12th and 16th centuries; characterized by slender vertical piers and counterbalancing buttresses and by vaulting and pointed arches
H	He was king of England from 21 April 1509 until his death. He was the second monarch of the Tudor dynasty. He is known for his role in the separation of the Church of England from the Roman Catholic Church
I	She was the third Prime Minister of India and a central figure of the Indian National Congress party. Gandhi, She was the only woman to hold the office.
J	He was an unidentified murderer who killed at least seven prostitutes in London's East End between August and November 1888
K	It is a room or an area equipped for preparing and cooking food.
L	It is the religious doctrines and church polity of Martin Luther, 16th-century German theologian, author, and leader of the Protestant Reformation.
M	She is a rock singer and film actress. Her records include Like a Virgin (1985), Like a Prayer (1989), Ray of Light (1998), Music (2000), and MDNA (2012). Her films include Desperately Seeking Susan (1985) and Evita (1996)
N	The capital and largest city of Kenya, in the south-central part of the country. Founded in 1899, it became the seat of government for British East Africa in 1905 and capital of independent Kenya in 1963.
Ñ (containing)	It is a parliamentary monarchy in southwestern Europe; a former colonial power
O	The entire body of salt water that covers more than 70 percent of the earth's surface.
P	It is a platform extending from a shore over water and supported by piles or pillars, used to secure, protect, and provide access to ships or boats.
Q	It is a woman sovereign.
R	It is a genre of popular music originating in the 1950s; a blend of black rhythm-and-blues with white country-and-western
S	It is a computer that processes requests for HTML and other documents that are components of webpages.
