A	It is rocky island of northern California in San Francisco Bay. It was a military prison from 1859 to 1933 and a federal prison until 1963. The island has long been known as "the Rock."
B	It is an American singer, songwriter and actress. Born and raised in Houston, Texas and performing in singing and dancing competitions, she began her music career aged sixteen as lead singer of R&B girl-group Destiny's Child.
C	Polish composer and pianist active in France, who wrote chiefly for the piano: noted for his harmonic imagination and his lyrical and melancholy qualities
D	They are a diverse group of animals first appeared during the Triassic period, approximately 237 million years ago, and were the dominant terrestrial vertebrates for 135 million years, from the beginning of the Jurassic (about 201 million years ago) until the end of the Cretaceous (66 million years ago), when the Cretaceous–Paleogene extinction event led to the extinction of most dinosaur groups at the close of the Mesozoic Era.
E	This state is a Republic in the Baltic region of Northern Europe. It is bordered to the north by the Gulf of Finland, to the west by the Baltic Sea, to the south by Latvia (343 km), and to the east by Lake Peipus and Russia (338.6 km).
F	It is a family of musical instruments in the woodwind group. Unlike woodwind instruments with reeds, it is an aerophone or reedless wind instrument that produces its sound from the flow of air across an opening.
G	It is an African ruminant mammal (<i>Giraffa camelopardalis</i>) having a very long neck and legs, a tan coat with orange-brown to black blotches, and short horns. It is the tallest land animal, often reaching a height of 5 meters (16 feet).
H	He was an American industrialist, the founder of a very well-known cars company, and sponsor of the development of the assembly line technique of mass production. He did not invent the automobile, but he developed and manufactured the first automobile that many middle class Americans could afford to buy.
I	It is a theory or style of painting originating and developed in France during the 1870s, characterized by concentration on the immediate visual impression produced by a scene and by the use of unmixed primary colors and small strokes to simulate actual reflected light.
J	He was a French novelist, poet, and playwright best known for his adventure novels and his profound influence on the literary genre of science fiction.
K	Russian abstract painter who considered form and color capable of expression. A founder of the Blaue Reiter, a German group of abstract expressionists, he also taught at the Bauhaus School (1922-1933).
L	He is a Polish professional footballer who plays as a striker for German club Bayern Munich, and captains the Poland national team.
M	It is an event that appears inexplicable by the laws of nature and so is held to be supernatural in origin or an act of God.
N	The longest river in the world, flowing about 6,675 km (4,150 mi) through eastern Africa from its most remote sources in Burundi to a delta on the Mediterranean Sea in northeast Egypt..

O	Any of several evergreen trees of the genus <i>Citrus</i> of Southeast Asia, widely cultivated in warm regions and having fragrant white flowers and round fruit with a yellowish or reddish rind and a sectioned, pulpy interior, especially the sweet orange and the bitter orange.
P	It is a semi-circular dumpling with any of various fillings, such as finely chopped meat or vegetables, that is often sautéed after being boiled.
Q	It is the standard monetary unit of Guatemala, divided into 100 centavos. It is also any of several tropical American birds of the genera <i>Pharomachus</i> and <i>Euptilotis</i> having brilliant bronze-green and red plumage and, in the male, long flowing tail feathers, especially <i>P. mocinno</i> of Central America
R	He is a Polish-French film director, producer, writer, and actor. Having made films in Poland, the United Kingdom, France and the United States, he is considered one of the few "truly international filmmakers." [
S	This grammy-winning Latina pop singer was born in Barranquilla, Colombia, on February 2, 1977. Her father is a Lebanese American immigrant and her mother a native of Colombia of Italian and Spanish descent. Shakira began her musical career at age 12

U	It is an Irish rock band from Dublin. Formed in 1976, the group consists of Bono (vocals and rhythm guitar), the Edge (lead guitar, keyboards, and vocals), Adam Clayton (bass guitar), and Larry Mullen, Jr. (drums and percussion).
V	It is a city in northeastern Italy sited on a group of 117 small islands separated by canals and linked by bridges.
W	It is a town of central Belgium near Brussels. Napoleon met his final defeat in the Battle of this town (June 18, 1815). It is also an Abba's song
X	It is a dense, colorless element found in small amounts in the atmosphere
